Inactive Account or Dormant Accounts

Do you have an account that you have not used in a while? If so, it could become an inactive account. We will be reviewing inactive accounts in April. Accounts with no activity for 365 days (12 months) are considered inactive and will be charged a \$10 inactive fee. If the account has had no activity for 5 years or more, SC Abandoned Property Act requires all financial institutions to turn over the funds in the account to the state.

TIPS TO PREVENT ID THEFT DURING TAX SEASON

Take Steps To Protect Your Social Security Number

Your Social Security number is necessary for a fraudster to use your identity for ID theft. Taking steps to protect your SSN helps you minimize the risk of identity theft (and a host of other problems). There are standard best practices that you can follow:



- ▶ Don't carry your Social Security card in your wallet or purse
- ▶ Keep your cards locked up at home
- ▶ Get a locking mailbox and retrieve your mail promptly every day
- ▶ Shred documents that include your SSN and other personal data before you toss them
- ▶ Avoid putting your SSN on forms at doctors' offices, hospitals, and other service providers – even if they ask for it, see if it's required

Additionally, you can register your Social Security number at www.ssa.gov/myaccount to open a "my Social Security account" online.
